A 1970s home goes from dated contemporary to modern prairie.

ADDRESS 1180 E. Beechwood Drive, Buckhead THE PROPERTY Atlanta builder Epic Development acquired this Frank Lloyd Wright-inspired home (originally built by Atlanta architect James Patterson in 1970) in spring 2011 for a little more than \$330,000. WOW FACTOR FEATURES Epic's Rick Bennett drafted an eye-catching design, complete with a floating

staircase in the foyer, huge windows and decks, and outdoor living areas overlooking the 1-acre lot's meandering creek and a 25-foot waterfall. The modern makeover took about five months and attracted the attention of HGTV'S Bang for Your Buck show before the home was snapped off the market for \$915,000 in May 2012. -Wendy Bowman-Littler
