

Deadline Approaching for **Energy Efficiency** Savings

Time is running out to take advantage of certain tax credits and rebates on qualifying Energy Star products and home energy efficiency improvements, expiring Dec. 31, 2011. These include:

· Federal tax credits Homeowners can receive a 10 percent tax credit on

purchases of insulation, metal or asphalt roofs, doors and skylights up to \$500 and up to \$200 on replacement windows. Tax credits of \$30 to \$500 are also available on purchases up to \$500 for HVAC equipment, non-solar water heaters and biomass stoves. For more information, visit www.energystar.gov.

· Georgia Power rebates Georgia Power customers can save up to \$2,200 in rebates on whole-house energy efficiency upgrades and up to \$700 in rebates on individual projects. The maximum rebate for all incentives is 50 percent of the cost. Qualifying improvements include the purchase of select Energy Star clothes washers and refrigerators; new insulation, programmable thermostats and energy-efficient water heaters; and professional air-sealing and ductsealing services.
